


# Successful Completion of Az-Zour North IWPP Phase 1 Project

#### **B. TPC Shutdown Maintenance**

JML was awarded a Safety Performance Award in recognition of its good safety performance, good quality and timely completion of major turnaround works at TPC, PCS complex.

This shutdown was carried out on 4 plants—BL1, BL2, TREX and SPEL-2. More than 400 equipment, manholes, safety valves, reactor, drum, heat exchangers, filters, 4 extruders, 11 blowers, 2 compressors and various pumps and agitators were overhauled with a manpower of 500,





within the short time frame of only 20 days. Working with such huge manpower, the job proved to be a challenge; one which JML successfully overcame.

# C. Jurong Synthetic Expansion Brown Field Project

JML was awarded a project for 40 numbers of Tank installation, fabrication and installation of pipe racks and pipes, and equipment installation for the Jurong Synthetic Project at Shipyard Road, Singapore, for ExxonMobil. JML undertook this brown field project, which had its peak manpower estimated at 350 in September and October 2016, from Foster Wheeler. JML was also awarded the Best Contractor Award for exercising the best safety practices on site.

The scope of work for the project includes 300 numbers of mechanical equipment installation, and fabrication and erection of piping with quantum of 120,000 diameter inch. This project is targeted to be completed by April 2017.
